Summary of role

The Web Developer will provide essential backend and frontend development for Bible Society's web products and experiences. The role will include the development of new initiatives and the maintenance of existing platforms and digital assets. The role requires a solid working knowledge of core web technologies and modern backend frameworks such as Node.js, JavaScript, PHP as well as frontend technologies such including HTML, CSS, React and Next.js. The role, which sits within the Web Development Team, will report to the Web Development Manager and work alongside other developers and designers.

Main responsibilities

- Help develop mobile-first web applications, plugins, products and experiences
- Write maintainable object-oriented Node.js, JavaScript, PHP, React, Next.js, HTML and CSS adhering to best practices and use of modern frameworks
- Back-end development using Node.js, PHP and MySQL
- Write front-end HTML, CSS and JavaScript to build responsive web applications optimised for mobile and tablet devices using frameworks such as Bootstrap and jQuery
- Development of shared services for our web platform, such as extended search and single sign on
- Development of our bespoke plugins to standard web technologies such as our headless CMS
- Work with the latest technologies to integrate solutions using APIs, libraries and frameworks
- Work with others in the web development team to seek new cutting-edge web technologies and trends, keeping up-to-date with digital best practices and usability/accessibility guidelines
- Deal with technical queries and problems with any of our web products internally and with external clients via email, telephone or in person
- Development of our Online Bible digital products
