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Chat with our Chief Exec

Q: What can we give thanks for as Bible Society from 2021?

A: Although we've experienced difficulties and the loss of loved ones as a result of Covid, on the whole our staff have been well, healthy and safe, for which I'm very grateful.

I am thankful for our recruitment last year. We were concerned about recruitment given the difficulties with Covid, but we've had some excellent senior hires who've really made a difference. It's wonderful that God has brought more quality people to our teams.

We're really grateful for our supporters. Many charities have had to cut wages or lay people off but because of your generosity we haven't had to do those things. We have been able to continue undertaking our mission and growing in our ability to have an impact.

The highlight of Bible engagement for us last year was the Psalm 23 Garden at the RHS Chelsea Flower Show, which won several awards. But more importantly, it was an exciting opportunity to see many people who haven't engaged with the Bible before, or for a very long time, being touched, excited, moved and engaged by Psalm 23 as they looked at this garden and talked with our volunteers.



Q: What plans can our supporters pray for in 2022?

A: We are really excited to be focusing on Bible engagement and mobilising the Church for Bible engagement among the spiritually open and those who are even cooler towards the Bible. This is the focus of the coming year, here at home and globally. There will be some great initiatives and gatherings of churches and equipping for Bible mission with unreached audiences in this country.

We're also launching a major global Bible engagement and audience research project with our sister Bible Societies around the world. Please pray for this project, which is complex and ambitious.

Finally, please pray for our leadership at Bible Society. The experience of the pandemic has been very demanding and tiring for everyone, but particularly for our leaders. Leadership is important in bringing clarity and vision, and helping people feel cared for and able to focus on their work. So, please do pray for Bible Society's leaders: for their protection, encouragement and the strengthening of God this year.

'Watershed moment' for Chinese Church

China is changing. But while one door closes, another opens – and your support means Bible ministry is adapting fast to ensure the message of Jesus reaches those who need to hear it.

Once home to the fastest-growing Church on the planet, today, China is tightening up.

The stricter implementation of religious law since 2020 and pandemic control measures have limited the activities of the Church in China to low key and minimal. The creation of harmony between Bible teaching and authoritative Chinese ideas and culture is taking place under the agenda of theological sinicisation.

The increasingly enforced regulations are designed to limit the spread of what is seen in China as 'Western' ideology. Many Bible Society projects to share God's word have faced obstacles in recent years – not just due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Under these circumstances, many Christians are valuing the Bible even more. Not satisfied with only having a Bible available to them, they now want to understand God's word even deeper. For instance, reading biblical languages, doing in-depth biblical study and gaining theological education online have become new trends.



But while circumstances are difficult in China, they are easier elsewhere – and the opportunity to reach Chinese people with the message of Jesus has moved much closer to home.

Every year, more than 100,000 Chinese students come to UK universities to study; they are by far the largest group of international students. Meanwhile, half a million Hong Kong residents will arrive here in the next three years. They're just the first wave; three million people are eligible for permanent visas.

For Dr Yinxuan Huang, a researcher working with Bible Society, it's an exciting time. 'Chinese Christianity is at a very important junction. Covid, social and political changes, restrictive regulations against Christianity, the movement of people from Hong Kong ... This is a watershed moment, and we don't exactly know what will happen next,' he said.

What's clear is that there are tremendous opportunities to share God's word with Chinese people, right here in England and Wales.

Thanks to your support, Bible Society is adapting rapidly to reach the diaspora community.

Just a few months ago, we brought more than 20 Chinese church leaders together, to equip them to share the Bible with students and others.

Research is being carried out to understand the need, new resources are in development, and there are further plans on the horizon. The mission field might look different – but God's word will not be held back, and your support makes it all possible.

Your impact in the Middle East

Demand for the Bible has never been higher – and, right now, there are real opportunities to share God’s word. Your support is bringing the hope and faith in God where they are needed most.

The Middle East and North Africa remains in the grip of crisis. Years of unprecedented violence have traumatised children and plunged millions into poverty. The Covid-19 pandemic only added another layer of hardship to a desperate situation.

But your support is bringing hope, healing and faith where they are needed most. Here’s a snapshot of your amazing impact in the Middle East, as you share the Bible and change people’s lives.



Lebanon: Children’s ministry

**Three-quarter of families in poverty
1 in 4 people are under 15**

Lebanon is in the midst of a deep economic recession; the currency is collapsing, basic goods are in short supply, and there’s been deadly violence on the streets. Our team has always prioritised children’s ministry – and now, that’s vital.

Your support is bringing our unique clown and puppet show to schools and refugee camps, to retell Bible stories, and our national Bible quiz engages 10,000 children a year. Our Beirut exhibition, Bible World, is welcoming visitors again following lockdown.



Syria: Supporting the Church

Conflict continues in many areas of Syria. Around 80 per cent of people live below the poverty line, and millions of families are displaced with little hope of returning home.

In the midst of it all, our amazing team faithfully serves. Your support helps distribute Scripture, train leaders, support persecuted Christians and care for families.

George Andrea, who leads Bible Society from our base in Aleppo, said, ‘We might be physically exhausted, but we are sharing treasures with people across Syria. Thanks to you, we are not alone!’

Jordan: Trauma healing

A generation traumatised by war

1994: Our first Bible-based trauma healing launched

Our teams see the devastating consequences of trauma every day: children who have lost the ability to speak, teens who are aggressive and abusing drugs, adults without hope. Your support will train 100 new trauma healing facilitators in Jordan this year, so they’ll be equipped to run Bible-based healing sessions with refugees and others.

One refugee, Sarab, who took part with her family, said, ‘It was worth the journey from Syria to Jordan to see the transformation in my children. My pain is overcome by joy now I know the children can grow up in peace and love.’

Lina’s story

‘I am so happy to receive my first Bible!’

Thirteen-year-old Lina* leans over and immerses herself in the pages of the Bible she’s just received.

Christians are in a tiny minority in Jordan, where Lina lives. With growing friction between moderate and radical Islamic elements, there’s a simmering tension in this authoritarian nation. But every Friday, as others head to the mosque for prayers, Lina skips through the narrow streets of Amman to join our youth group.

‘I always feel unloved being the only girl in a house filled with boys, but here I feel Jesus’ love for me,’ said Lina. ‘I eagerly wait for Friday to go to church and hear new stories about Jesus. I love learning about him.’

Your support is putting Bibles into the hands of young people like Lina, equipping them to be strong Christian witnesses in a troubled region; thank you so much.

The Psalm 23 Garden wins gold at the RHS Chelsea Flower Show



Bible Society's Psalm 23 Garden at September's RHS Chelsea Flower Show was a triumph of design, and won yet another gold medal for its creator Sarah Eberle – not to mention an award for Best Construction and another for Best Sanctuary Garden.

But winning medals wasn't the point of it, of course. In an age when – in the West, at least – Scripture is often ignored or forgotten, the Psalm 23 Garden was a way of saying to huge numbers of people, 'The Bible has something to say to you today.' Its depiction of the green pastures and quiet waters spoke of the times of rest we experience in our lives, and particularly of the healing power of God's creation.

The water falling into the pool evoked refreshment, but it was not a comfortable landscape – the stepping stones and the huge rocks created a sense of difficulty and danger, a reference to the 'valley of the shadow of death' of which the psalmist speaks. At the same time, it was a place of life and movement – not just because of the falling water, but because it was quickly colonised by insects of all kinds.

On the first morning it was open, bees were busy in the eupatoria, a butterfly rested on one of the warm stones and a dragonfly investigated the pool. There was also a robin, who sang from the waterfall rock.

The whole garden spoke of a passage through life, through good times and bad, with the Good Shepherd as our guide and guardian, and an eternal home at the end of the journey.

Sarah herself described the garden as 'deeply spiritual'. It touched the lives of many who saw it – our Bible Society volunteers at the Show were able to speak to many who were genuinely moved by it. Actor Jim Carter (Carson in *Downton Abbey*) called it 'a little piece of perfect heaven', while Sally Phillips, who opened it for us and read the psalm for the gathered media, reflected on how God speaks to us through the natural world as well as through the Bible.

A Chelsea Pensioner, Arthur Currie, who watched the Show go up from his window in the Hospital overlooking the ground, said: 'I think the garden was wonderful – one of, if not the best one there.' And there were many meaningful conversations, some of them tearful, with people who were able to make the connection between their own life experiences and the green pastures and dark valleys of the psalm. This was Scripture in action, and a striking demonstration of the power of the word of God in the lives of those who in their everyday lives might pay it little or no attention at all.

Apart from those who saw it in real life, there was extensive coverage on the BBC, which has the exclusive rights to broadcast the Show. The garden was featured on local and national radio stations, in gardening and lifestyle magazines, and in Christian media too. For many, the idea that part of the Bible could speak into their lives today was a revelation. In this time of pandemic, when the shadow of death has hovered over so many lives, this psalm has rarely

seemed more relevant. Making a connection between a garden and the Bible has allowed it to speak to a different sort of audience, most of them not churchgoers. God's word is enduringly powerful; sometimes we need to find new ways of making it heard.

While the Show may be over, this is not the end of the garden. It has been re-created at the new Winchester Hospice, and will provide a place of spiritual nourishment and reflection for patients, their families and the hospice staff for many years to come. It will be clearly identified as the Psalm 23 Garden, and those who may be at a very difficult stage of their lives will be pointed again to the God who loves them and walks with them to the end.

You need four elements: a tree, water, a meadow (a few square metres will do!) and somewhere to sit.

Lighting a path through the dark

At Bible Society, we've started a programme called Navigating Trauma. One of Bible Society's aims is to catalyse Bible inspired change in the world. We believe that God's word is powerful and that he works through it to change lives, for good.

Navigating Trauma is a Scripture-based programme that leads people through trauma towards a place of peace.

It uses Scripture to help people who've experienced trauma to reflect on what they've suffered. As they enter the world of the Bible, they find their own stories there too. Sharing their insights and responses leads to deep encounters with one another and with God.

Navigating Trauma isn't a quick fix, and we don't claim it will heal every hurt. But working through the programme with others can help to build resilience and give participants the tools they need to live full and rich lives again. The word 'trauma' describes our response to events like disaster, violence or abuse, whether those are single events or ongoing.

Trauma doesn't go away over a set period of time. Sometimes, it can have a long-lasting effect on our relationship with God, our friends and our family, and may

even affect the way we relate to ourselves. However, God is always close to the broken-hearted. The Bible shows us how God relates to those who are suffering. With the Navigating Trauma programme, Scripture is the compass we look to, to guide us towards wholeness.

The Navigating Trauma programme is designed to help you and the people you journey with to address the lasting effects of trauma. It uses a fusion of mental health best practice and contextual Bible reading to help churches, faith groups and chaplains. Originally formed in North Africa, it is licensed by the Trauma Healing Institute, an extension of the American Bible Society.

The programme consists of six core lessons, and up to eight optional ones. Each lesson starts with a story. The story leads into an interactive session around questions of loss or grief. From this discussion the lesson moves to the question of how best we can support those who have experienced different types of suffering in their lives. To aid discussion, there are stories from Scripture, illustrative examples, creative exercises and personal reflections. Paramount to the programme is that every lesson comes back to Scripture to help answer the questions that arise through the lesson.

All of the sessions are delivered in small groups run by trained volunteers. At Bible Society, we provide the training for you to become a facilitator in Navigating Trauma. Perhaps you don't know what the Bible has to say about trauma. Or you might know the Bible well, but would like to understand more about mental health best practice. We are looking for people who are kind and reliable to come and receive training to deliver the programme.

Of course, we must ensure that Navigating Trauma is safe for both the facilitators and the participants, so we need to partner with churches and organisations to deliver the programme. If you want to be part of this new programme, you can visit the Bible Society website (biblesociety.org.uk) and search for Navigating Trauma. This will give you information about the programme and details of the process to follow, to register your interest.

The next step is to attend an Online Gathering, the next one planned is on 25 March 2022. These sessions will give you a taste of Navigating Trauma. We will show you more about the programme and help you decide whether you might want to get involved.

Once you've come along to an Online Gathering, we can continue the conversation about whether Navigating Trauma might work in your organisation's context. You will need the support of your church or organisation leader, to be put forward for training.

The leader will need to complete some safeguarding paperwork and ensure that you undertake a DBS check. If all of these are successfully completed, we'll invite you to a five-day training session to equip you to deliver Navigating Trauma. We hope that as partnerships grow, we can build a community of churches and organisations offering help to people across your local area.

Navigating Trauma offers a proven, Bible-based approach that helps churches, faith groups and chaplains to support their communities through the experience and impact of trauma. Partner with us, and together we can start a movement that changes lives and transforms communities.

The course is delivered via a new online platform that allows people to track their progress, watch the videos and engage with interactive content, and provides links to our online Bible.

While the core content is the same as the Group Edition, it has been adapted for individual use with extra content, and a new host (Joanna Adeyinka-Burford) will guide participants through the course.



What was life like for them under Roman rule? Is it true that Jesus' crucifixion was not the end of the road for him, that he was seen alive again?

Informative and interesting, *End of the Road?* takes us from Passover to the cross to the resurrection on Easter Day. This short book is perfect for those who would like to know more about the history behind the Easter story and can be used as a handout in churches or during outreach.







The Greatest Miracle of All


