Session 10: Mission.How can we be ambitious with the gospel?

ROMANS 15-16

KEY VERSE:

'Now to him who is able to establish you in accordance with my gospel ... to the only wise God be glory for ever through Jesus Christ! Amen.'

Possible issues

HOW DO WE EFFECTIVELY SHARE THE GOSPEL TODAY?

Response: There are lots of books and other resources to help us work out this question in a predominantly secular society. It would be worth looking at a few of these so that we can learn how to be relevant in our communication.

I DON'T FEEL CALLED TO BE AN EVANGELIST LIKE PAUL

Response: Many of us don't feel equipped to share the good news with others but we should pray for courage and wisdom. We may not have the words, but we can show genuine love, hospitality and care to the people God puts in our lives and pray for opportunities.
