## THE BOOKS OF THE BIBLE

I've indicated the stress at the start of some lines as it can be difficult to fit in some of the names of the books!

Sung to the tune of 'The Sons of the Prophet' – or any suitably jolly tune

The books of the Bible are easy to learn
If you can remember this rhyme:
The *first* book is Genesis: God makes the world
At the very beginning of time.

Exodus, Leviticus and Numbers come next; Deuteronomy is the fifth book, And these five together - the Jewish Torah -Are also called the Pentateuch.

Joshua and Judges and Ruth tell the tale: The history of God's Chosen Race, And two books of Samuel and both books of Kings With two *Chron*icles keep up the pace.

Ezra, Nehemiah and Esther and Job Continue their stories to tell, And next young King David produces the Psalms; and King Solomon writes Proverbs as well.

Ecclesiastes is a cynical book; The Song of Songs: lyrical love, Then come the great prophets - Isaiah comes first -Inspired by Jehovah above.

Jere*miah* spoke up, Lamentations comes next With Ezekiel, Daniel and Hosea, Joel and then Amos, Obadiah, Jonah With Micah and Nahum in the rear.

The last of the prophets from such ancient days: Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, The Old *Test*ament ends with just two further books - Zechariah and old Malachi.

Now dawns the New Testament with the Good News: The Gospels proclaim God's love song. The story of Jesus is told in four books - Those of *Matth*ew, Mark, Luke and then John.

The Acts of Apostles are set down for us; Their letters continue to guide. Paul wrote to the Romans, Corinthians twice, To Galatians and Ephesians besides.

Phi*lip*pians and Colossians were kept up to scratch, Thessalonians got two as well, Two Timothys, Titus, then brief Phile*mon:* Paul's loving concern they do tell.

The Epistles continue with Hebrews and James; Two letters from Peter were penned; Three letters from John and then finally Jude With Revelation: when Christ comes again!
